

COMMISSIONERS MINUTES 10-6-97

THE COMMISSIONERS MET IN THE CITY COUNCIL CONFERENCE ROOM OF THE CITY MUNICIPAL BUILDING, 301 S. BRANSON STREET, MARION, INDIANA 46952 ON MONDAY, OCTOBER 6, 1997 AT 8:30 A.M.

DICK PUCKETT CALLED THE MEETING TO ORDER AT 8:35 A.M.

IN ATTENDANCE WERE COMMISSIONERS DICK PUCKETT, DAVID GLICKFIELD AND WALT WOOD, AUDITOR JUDY CARMICHAEL, COUNCILMAN JOE ISAACS, AND HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT JOHN WEBSTER.

DICK PUCKETT CALLED THE MEETING TO ORDER AT 8:35 A.M.

WALT WOOD MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING AND TO APPROVE THE CURRENT PAYROLL. DAVID GLICKFIELD SECONDED THE MOTION AND THE MOTION CARRIED THREE AYES.

WALT WOOD MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE MAINTENANCE REPORT FOR THE LAST WEEK. DAVID GLICKFIELD SECONDED THE MOTION AND THE MOTION CARRIED THREE AYES.

JOHN WEBSTER REPORTED FOR THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT. HE STATED THAT THE COMMISSIONERS NEEDED TO APPOINT THREE MEMBERS TO BE ON THE COMMON CONSTRUCTION WAGE COMMITTEE FOR BRIDGE #181 IN MEIR. HE SUGGESTED THAT COUNTY ENGINEER IRVING MILLER, CITY ENGINEER MIKE SPIERS AND JEFF JACKSON FROM INDUSTRY BE APPOINTED. WALT WOOD MADE A MOTION TO APPOINT IRVING MILLER, MIKE SPIERS AND JEFF JACKSON TO THE WAGE COMMITTEE. DAVID GLICKFIELD SECONDED THE MOTION AND THE MOTION CARRIED THREE AYES. JOHN ALSO ANNOUNCED THAT PAVING WAS FINISHED ON 600E BETWEEN STATE ROAD 22 AND 200 SOUTH, THE SOD COMPLETED ON 200S BETWEEN 400E AND 600E AND WILL START PAVING TODAY WITH PLANS TO REOPEN BY THE END OF THE WEEK, AND THAT THEY RAN PUG MIX ON 700E BETWEEN STATE ROAD #22 AND 600S AND WILL BE DOING 700E BETWEEN WHEELING PIKE AND 700S THIS WEEK.

WALT WOOD MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE ANIMAL REPORT FOR SEPTEMBER, 1997. DAVID GLICKFIELD SECONDED THE MOTION AND THE MOTION CARRIED THREE AYES. MR. ISAACS REPORTED THAT HE HAD PICKED UP A WILD DOG ON FRIDAY AND DELIVERED IT TO THE HUMANE SOCIETY. HE STATED THEY TOOK THE DOG FROM HIS TRUCK WITH SNARE POLES AND THAT HE WAS AFRAID THAT IF IT GOT LOOSE IT WOULD BITE SOMEONE.

WALT WOOD MADE A MOTION TO ACCEPT THE BID FROM GEORGE JUNIOR REPUBLIC REALTY FOR \$18,750 FOR TWO ACRES OF THE COUNTY FARM ON GARTHWAITE ROAD. DAVID GLICKFIELD SECONDED THE MOTION AND THE MOTION CARRIED THREE AYES.

JOHN WEBSTER STATED HE HAD TALKED WITH DEAN SMITH OF SOLID WASTE ABOUT THE RUBBER TIRE STORAGE AND DISPOSAL. MR. SMITH SUGGESTED PUTTING A TRAILER AT THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT FOR A COST OF \$900. A MONTH. MR. WEBSTER SAID THAT IT IS AGAINST THE LAW TO STORE THEM FOR LONG PERIODS OF TIME AND TO PILE THEM OUTSIDE.

WALT WOOD ALSO REPORTED THAT HE HAD TALKED WITH TOM PERRY, PROJECT MANAGER OF THE COMPLEX, AND THAT NEXT WEEK THE ROOF WOULD BE DONE, AND THE WINDOWS SHOULD BE IN AND THE BUILDING ENCLOSED BY HALLOWEEN. THE PROJECT IS ABOUT ONE MONTH AHEAD OF SCHEDULE.

THE MEETING WAS RECESSED AT 8:58 A.M.
