AT 9:15 A.M. THE MEETING WAS WITH JUDY CARMICHAEL. ITEMS DISCUSSED WERE:

TO THE COMMISSIONERS WITH RECOMMENDATIONS.

AT 10:00 A.M. THE COMMISSIONERS MET WITH CLIFF SESSOMS OF THE MARION POLICE DEPARTMENT REGARDING A REQUEST FOR 911 MONIES. THE REQUEST WAS FOR A VOICE LOGGING SYSTEM AT A COST OF \$26,450. THE DEPARTMENT CAN CONTRIBUTE \$10,000 AND ASKED THE COMMISSIONERS FOR \$16,450 FROM THE 911 FUND. WALT WOOD MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE PURCHASE AND ASKED THE DEPARTMENT TO SET UP PAYMENTS ON A MONTHLY BASIS. DAVID GLICKFIELD SECONDED THE MOTION AND THE MOTION CARRIED. PAYMENTS WILL BE \$875.30 PER MONTH BEGINNING IN JULY, 1998.

AT 10:30 A.M. THE COMMISSIONERS MET WITH ED MYERS OF JOHNSON CONTROLS. THE DISCUSSION INCLUDED PERFORMANCE CONTRACTS, THE CCD LEVY, AND FINANCING OF APPROXIMATELY \$650,000 FOR 10 YEARS AT 5%.
